



A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR

A Year of Major Achievements

he year 2023 can be considered as a year full of successful achievements at the National Advanced School of Public Works (NASPW) at several levels.

Indeed, the year got off to an auspicious start when the President of the Republic, Head of State, took the laudable decision to instruct the recruitment of sixty (60) permanent teachers at NASPW over three years. Following the President's instructions, the Minister of State, Minister of Higher Education authorised the recruitment, in 2023, of a first group of thirty (30) teachers in our various training courses. Following a lengthy and well-conducted selection process, NASPW recruited 30 young teachers in Civil Engineering, Environmental Engineering, Rural Engineering, Land Surveying, Town Planning, Architecture, as well as in fundamental and cross-disciplinary sciences. The new intake began work on 1 January 2024. This recruitment will enable NASPW to fully play its role in training young Cameroonians in the field of Public Works and position itself as a centre of excellence both at national level and in the Central African sub-region..

As the icing on the cake, the Head of State gave his approval to the Minister of Finance for the payment of arrears due to the University of Padova under the partnership with this internationally renowned thousand-year-old university. After several years of waiting and patience, this payment has once again reassured our partners of government's desire to see this important partnership continue hitch-free and strengthen further.

NASPW had the rare privilege of welcoming the Ambassador of the United States of America, His Excellency Christopher John LAMORA, within the framewotk of the Fulbright Programme funded by the American Government. This visit, during which he made an important donation of books to NASPW, contributed significantly to raising the School's profile both nationally and internationally.

Within the framework of its cooperation with Golden Gate University in San Francisco, the school recruited the second batch of students for the Master's degree in Engineering Management. This Master's programme enjoys the support of specialists from the American Fulbright programme.

During the year, following a highly selective process, we recruited the second batch of students for the specialised Master's programme in Transport Planning. This programme, which is being implemented by NASPW in partnership with three renowned international universities, notably the University of Padova, the University of Rome Sapienza - Italy and Université Libre de Bruxelles in Belgium, is financed by the World Bank. I would like to take this opportunity to underscore the achievements of this highly beneficial partnership. Still in the field of Specialised Masters, the second batch of students in the Master's programme in Engineering Management implemented in partnership with San Francisco's



Golden Gate University was recruited by competitive examination.

We should not forget the World Bank's selection, on a highly competitive basis at continental level, of five (5) students, including three in Civil Engineering and two in Environmental Engineering, for a one-year internship in its agencies around the world. Working in a global institution like the World Bank, gives trainees the opportunity to gain experience from the best experts in various specialist fields. These student trainees are considered worthy representatives of NASPW's training excellence.

To further promote its image, the school played a key role in promotional activities such as the Government Action Fair (SAGO), alongside other structures under the supervision of the Ministry of Public Works, the main institutional partner of this event. NASPW took advantage of the opportunity to showcase its many training courses in the various public works trades to visitors.

I would like to take this opportunity to express our gratitude to all those who contributed in one way or another to all these achievements. I wish all our readers a Happy New Year.

PRESENTATION

he National Advanced School of Public Works (NASPW) was founded in 1970 by decree of the President of the Republic and was then known as the National Schoolof Technology (NST). It is a public establishment offering technical vocational training in the building and public works trades. NASPW owes its current name to Decree No. 82/464 of 4 October 1982. Its was reorganised by Decree No. 2016/426 of 26 October 2016 and became a public higher education institution with special status. The institution is placed under the technical supervision of the Ministry in charge of Public Works, under the academic supervision of the Ministry in charge of Higher Education and under the financial supervision of the Ministry in charge of Finance. Its head office is located in Yaounde. It also comprises :

- An Annex school in Buea which trains Higher Technicians (BAC/GCE ALs+2 years); Ordinary Technicians (Probatoire/GCE Al + 2 years); and Basic Technicians (BEPC/GCE OLs+2 years).
- Two Public Works Trades Centres (PWTCs) in Akonolinga and Garoua respectively, which train Assistant Technicians (CEP and First School Leaving Certficate + 6 months).

At the institutional level, Decree No. 2019/541 of 14 October 2019 and Decree No. 2019/542 of 14 October 2019 set up two management bodies: a Board of Directors, chaired by Mrs LEKEUFACK née METANGMO Virginie, and the Directorate, which is headed by Professor NKENG George ELAMBO, Director of this benchmark institution in the field of Public Works and Architecture.

The 2023 academic year at the National Advanced School of Public Works, Buea Annexgot off to a good start with classes for Semesters 2 and 4 for the 2022/2023 academic year, followed by end-of-study projects for second-year students. The first and third Semesters of 3 modules for the 2022/2023 year started in October 2022 for Semester 3 and in December 2022 for Semester 1.

The academic organisation of this institution offers three degree courses sanctioned by the award of Certificates. The first course, which is open to holders of two GCE AL papers or a scientific Baccalauréat, offers a two-year course leading to the Higher Technician Diploma for Higher Technicians in related disciplines in the Public Works sector.

Garoua Public Works Trades Centre

The Public Works Trades Centre (PWTC) in Garoua, created by Decree No.91/291 of 21 June 1991, is an annex of the National Advanced School of Public Works (NASPW) in Yaounde. It has been strengthened in its role as the secular arm of the State for retraining and building the capacity of the staff of the Ministry of Public Works. The Centre is responsible for :

- Retraining and further training for Ministry of Public Works staff;
- Receiving (retraining and further training) personnel from public, private and semi-public companies (local authorities, Crédit Foncier du Cameroun, etc.), under the conditions laid down by the aforementioned decree.
- This type of training is sanction by the award of an Assistant Technician Certificate in Public Works.
- A selection test for holders of the CEP/FSLC has bewas launched by the Minister of Public Works for 200 places in seven (7) fields:
 - Maintenance of Sanitation Works (E.O.A): 30 places ;
- Road maintenance using the HIMO method (ERH): 30 places;
- Masonry (MAC): 30 places;
- Plumbing and sanitation (PLS): 30 places;
- Tiling (CAR): 30 places;
- Painting (PEINT): 30 places;
- Electricity (ELEC): 20 places.

The Government's strategy to meet the objectives of the National Development Strategy by 2030, namely the construction of a critical and visible mass of infrastructure, is to professionalise the sector (PWTC-A).

To implement this commitment, the Minister of Public Works launched a programme to train 1,500 young Cameroonians in the building and public works sector. In line with this programme, Government decided to reorientate and rehabilitate specialised technical and vocational training centres, such as the Public Works Trades Centre in Akonolinga.

In the Area of Cooperation

NASPW is an active member of several renowned international university associations, including:

- Agence Universitaire de la Francophonie (AUF);

- The Association of African Universities (AAU):

Pr NKENG George ELAMBO, elected Deputy Member of the Board of Directors of the AAU for the period 2021 - 2025, is now one of the 17 members of the said Board who represent all the universities in Africa. They are elected by 500 members;

- International Association of Universities (IAU).

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Since 2010, NASPW established an academic partnership with the University of Padova (Italy). The general objective of of the partnership is to train engineers (Civil Engineering, Environmental Engineering, Land Surveying and Town Planning) at Baccalauréat and GCE ALs+ 5 level. A major innovation introduced in 2017 is the effective opening of a complete Architecture Cycle at Baccalaureat and GCE ALs+ 5 level, which has already enrolled four batches.

In 2020, it entered into an academic partnership with Golden Gate University in San Francisco (USA) with the aim of training engineers in Engineering Management at Bachelor + 2 level.

In 2021, it also established an academic partnership with the University of Rome Sapienza, the University of Padova and Université Libre de Bruxelles. The partnership aims to offer a Master's degree in Transport Planning at Bachelor + 2 level. This training is financed by the World Bank (IBRD, Credit N 8650 -CM) within the framework of its Transport Sector Development Project.

In the Area of Training

NASPW Yaounde, in partnership with the universities listed below, has set up the following training courses:

- Master of Engineering, Bac/GCE level ALs+5 years;

- Architecture degree (Bac/GCE ALs+5 years);

- **Specialised Masters** (Bachelor's degree/Works Engineer +2 years)
- The course covers a wide range of subjects, including Architecture, Civil Engineering, Water, Waste and Sanitation, and Eco-Construction.


SUPERVISORY MINISTRIES

b-Running of the Training

NASPW Yaounde

One hundred and seventy-three (173) lecturers were involved in the course, of which fortyfour (44) from the University of Padova, twenty (20) permanent lecturers and one hundred and nine (109) part-time Teachers.

► Program coverage rate

The coverage rate is between 90% and 100% in the following fields and levels:

- MEng 1 and MEng 2: Common Core
- MEng 3: Civil Engineering, Environmental Engineering and Land Surveying
- MEng 4 and MEng 5: Civil Engineering, Environmental Engineering, Land Surveyingand Town Planning
- MArc 1, MArc 2, MArc 3 and MArc 4
- Running of Courses and activities
 - Most face-to-face courses are taught by local lecturers. Online courses are taught for the most part by lecturers from the University of Padova and Golden Gate.
 - Practical work and tutorials are carried out as scheduled. However, they are experiencing difficulties due to the shortage of laboratory technicians.

In view of the following statistics, the academic performance recorded during the 2020- 2021 academic year is satisfactory, with an overall pass rate of around 86%. In detail, these performances are as follows:





B- Applied research and development support at NASPW Yaounde

Civil Engineering Department

Research activities in the Civil Engineering Department during the 2022/2023 academic year focused on three main areas, namely dissertation supervision, publication of articles and development projects.

Supervision activities involved the joint supervision of 104 diploma theses in cooperation with the University of Padova, including 66 in Structures and 38 in Geotechnics. In terms of publications, 6 articles were published in internationally-renowned journals, and a patent was obtained in Structures.

Environmental Engineering Department

Out of a total of 42 students, 25 defended their dissertations. The Environmental Engineering Department published a number of scientific articles in leading scientific journals. These articles were mainly written by Pr NKENG George ELAMBO and Pr TALLA André.

► Land Surveying Department

Forty-five (45) research dissertations were submitted in the fields of Topography, Geometry, Cadastre and Photogrammetry.

► Town Planning Department

Twelve (12) students defended their research theses in the following areas:

- Urban Energy;
- Urban Mobility;
- Urban Sanitation

► Architecture Department

Sixty (60) students defended their research dissertations

C-Governance and Institutional Support

The activities carried out in the governance and institutional support programme enabled us to execute all budgeted activities on time. The activities were grouped under three (3) actions:

- Coordination and monitoring of the activities of various services;
- Improving the working environment;
- Management of human and financial resources.

Training activities proceeded smoothly, thanks to improved administrative and budgetary coordination to ensure teacher mobility and availability, and improved working conditions. In terms of infrastructure, work on the construction of the administrative building was interrupted due to lack of financial resources. Building rehabilitation work is ongoing.

It should be noted that pursued efforts to acquire state-of-the-art teaching equipment in 2023. A number of related projects were initiated and completed on schedule.

NASPW's ongoing infrastructure policy has had a positive impact on the health of its real estate assets. NASPW Yaounde now has 21 classrooms equipped with teaching materials, with capacities ranging from 60 to 100 seats, two (2) amphitheatres with 100 and 500 seats, four (4) laboratories, a library, an infirmary, a sports complex and a restaurant.

An inventory of NASPW Yaounde's movable assets was also made and they were estimated at nearly two (2) billion CFA francs on 31 December 2014. This inventory of assets eases decision-making on the equipment of services.

For example, two (2) classrooms were equipped with furniture and modern projection machines to ease teaching.

All the classrooms are now occupied. There is therefore an enormous need in terms of classrooms and laboratory equipment.

At the budgetary level, the dialogue established between the services of the authorizing officer and those of the Ministry of Finance (Specialized Financial Control and Accounting Officer) enabled better processing of revenue and expenditure files, easy verification of data, and the process of extending the competence of the Specialized Financial Controller and Accounting Officer to all NASPW structures.



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DIFFICULTIES ENCOUNTERED AND

A- NASPW YAOUNDE

Despite the tremendious efforts made by the State, notably through the allocation of annual budgetary support for investment and operations, NASPWwas faced with a number of challenges which undermined the achievement of its objectives. These include :

1- Infrastructure

- Insufficient classrooms, especially amphitheatres. The limited number of classrooms undermined the accommodation capacity of the School and its ancillary structures, thereby jeopardizing their prospects for expansion. This has been addressed to the various supervisory bodies, with a view to finding adequate solutions;
- Outdated laboratory equipment prevents practical work from running smoothly.
- The ageing of the NASPW vehicle fleet, eight (8) out of ten (10) of which are over 7 years old;

2- Human Resources

Despite the positive impact of the implementation of the recruitment of 60 permanent teachers spread over 3 years, ordered by the Head of State, and the implementation of the global recruitment plan for non-teaching staff approved by the members of the Board of Directors and gradually implemented by the NASPW Management, there is still a need to absorb the current shortage of teaching and non-teaching staff.

3- Budgetary and Financial Level

- The mismatch between available budgetary resources and expenses makes it difficult to implement the action plan efficiently, particularly in view of the everdecreasing budgetary support package.
- Difficulties inherent in the procedure for releasing subsidy instalments constitute real stumbling blocks to the effective and efficient implementation of action plans. This is notably due to the mid-year reallocation of appropriations, even when the intended projects have actually been carried out.
- The existence of several circuits for processing budgetary support from the technical supervisory authority continues to reduce the visibility of the effective implementation of NASPW's overall action plan, and the production of exhaustive, reliable and sincere "budgetary and financial reporting" documents

SUGGESTIONS

B- NASPW ANNEX BUEA

- Buildings: The multimedia center is housed in an old, dilapidated wooden structure. There is an urgent need to build a permanent structure. In addition, it is imperative to build a modern 500-seat amphitheater. There is also an urgent need to build residences formanagers and the administrative and finance staff..
- Personnel: NASPW Annex Buea operates with 95% of its staff made up of part-time lecturers. There is therefore an urgent need to recruit teachers. The school also needs more support staff. We suggest that the temporary workers who have been assisting the school for many years should beabsorbed. The critical case of the drivers who drive the vehicles should be given serious attention. The Land Surveying Department has no permanent teaching staff. We suggest that those who have retired be absorbed under contract to continue.
- Budget allocation: student intake has increased considerably, since we have around 1,600 students. This brings with it many challenges. We are calling for a significant adjustment to the operating and investment budget, one (1) service vehicle for the Deputy Director, the Head of Administration and Finance, one (1) liaison pick-up vehicle and three (3) 30-seater buses for student excursions.

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C-PWTC GAROUA

While acknowledging the constant support of the Minister of Public Works, service operations and the improvement of the working environment remain a concern. These include

At the financial level :

- The slow execution of the 2022 budget, because management is centralized for both operations and the Public Investment Budget. Decentralization of resources would be ideal, along with a review of the amounts allocated to both operations and investments.
- The PWTC does not have a training budget. It is important to emphasize that the allocation of a training budget will ensure a good level of training, which should improve the performance of MINTP staff in the

field (retraining, upgrading and capacity-building) and the training of Public Works Assistant Technicians.

- The lines concerning mission orders, parttime teaching, bonuses and allowances should be clarified and specifically committed to, as the Garoua Regional Financial Controller poses problems in the management of these lines.

Human resources

 A shortage of support staff due to the recent transfer of some staff from the Garoua PWTC to the Regional Delegation of Public Works for the North in Garoua, the retirement of some staff or staff on probation who have resumed service. No watchmen to ensure the security of the administrative block, reception structures No. 1 and No. 2.

- The residence of the Director of the Garoua PWTC, night and day, and no driver, including the shortage of training staff.

- The recent assignment of three (3) staff members to the PWTC/GRA following their entry into service on 7 June 2021, 3 June 2021 and 5 November 2021 remains insufficient.

Therefore, to manage human resources at the Garoua Public Works Trade Centre, we suggest the recruitment of :

- Three (3) drivers ;
- Four (4) watchmen
- Three (3) cleaners;
- Three (3) Engineers;
- Four (4) Higher Technicians;
- Three (3) Ordinary Technicians.

The year's activities went smoothly at the Garoua PWTC, despite the delay in publishing the results of the training of Public Works Assistant Technicians. In 2022, the Garoua PWTC recorded a major innovation, with the addition of two (2) new courses (Masonry and Plumbing) and a good level of achievement of its objectives.

D-AKONOLINGA PWTC

The main problems encountered in fiscal year 2023 in implementing the Centre's activities relate to:

- insufficient budgetary resources
- growing insecurity at PWTC-A (series of aggravated thefts) ;
- untimely power cuts.

To enable the PWTC-A to improve its performance in carrying out the activities scheduled for the 2023 financial year, it would be advisable to :

- Increase budgetary resources to ensure the continuity of the plan to revive the Trades Centres, in order to ease implementation of the programme to train 1,500 young people in the building and public works trades for an Emerging Cameroon by 2035;
- Reinforce security by installing video surveillance cameras throughout the Centre and recruiting a licensed security company;
- Commit the subsidy resources allocated by MINTP at the start of the financial year;
- Reduce procurement deadlines;
- Increase the installation of solar lighting panels throughout the Centre to avoid untimely load shedding in the town of Akonolinga; ;
- We have had discussions with the African Development Bank, which is proposing to support PWTC-A through capacity building; scholarships will be awarded to young Cameroonians, a borehole will be built, certain buildings will be rehabilitated, the computer room will be equipped, training curricula will be updated and support will be provided in terms of marketing communications for PWTC-A, to the tune of 100,000,000 (one hundred million) CFA francs. The project is awaiting signature at MINEPAT after approval by the Head of State.

CONCLUSION

he quest for managerial excellence, observable not only in the quality of the training offered to students, but also in the adoption and implementation of best practices in administrative and financial management, will remain the credo of the management team of the National Advanced School of Public Works in 2023. All the more so as this ambition has been endorsed by the highest State authority and the Government through the various supervisory bodies. This is undoubtedly the legitimate interpretation that one could make with respect to the two major decisions that were taken during the year. These concern the approval for the special recruitment of 60 permanent teachers at the NASPW and thr autorisation of a special budgetary allocation to clear certain arrears related to the implementation of the academic, technical and didactic cooperation agreement concluded between the NASPW and the University of Padova.
